Local care professionals refer clients to the Foodbank who provide short term emergency food to these local people in crisis. Food is given as an intervention strategy which allows the care agencies time to put longer term measures in place. Every food parcel given out really makes a difference.

All food given out by the Foodbank is donated by generous members of the public and Cromer and District Foodbank would love you to be involved in helping people in need.

For this appeal we would be delighted to receive any of the following items:

Pasta sauce and pasta/rice
Tinned potatoes
Tinned rice pudding and sponge puddings
UHT Milk – Semi skimmed and full fat
Fruit juice
Tinned fruit
Tea bags
Crisps
Savoury snacks – the just add hot water varieties

Food is essential, but only part of the picture. Families in crisis have needs we might take for granted and common requests include shampoo and loo rolls for example. From time to time villagers bring in surplus garden produce, plants, magazines and books for others to share. All sorts of topics are discussed and this all goes to make the event a lively affair.

To sum up, the coffee morning is certainly a great success and contributes to enhancing village life and where people get together and chat in the old fashioned way, without the use of Facebook or Twitter!

News from County Councillor, Dr Marie Strong, Wells Division

Dear Residents

Better Broadband

It is some time since we started the process of bringing better broadband to Norfolk. Many of you will remember how I pushed people to sign a petition which would gain Government financial support and from the beginning Norfolk has progressed far more than many, if not most, counties. But that was based on the Government's promise that everyone would have 2Mbps. Now many homes and businesses want far higher speeds for all. And as a member of the new Digital Committee I will continue to work for good broadband for all and mobile phone coverage across our county.

In the meantime there are some who do not know if they have access to fibre broadband. To check if you can access fibre I have given the details below. (Please remember if fibre is available to you and you want to upgrade you need to check what providers are offering, make a decision and agree a contract with the provider. However, it is not compulsory to convert and if you are content with your existing provision no further action is required).

Having mentioned the government commitment to 2Mbps, for anyone with sub 2Mbps you can claim a voucher. Please see:

Anyone, including owners of properties referred to below, can check which cabinet serves your property and what speeds you can get. Use:

<https://www.btwholesale.com/includes/adsl/adsl.htm> Search by phone number if you are a BT Internet Service Provider (ISP) customer. Customers of other ISP's should use the Address Checker option, then enter their postcode, press submit and select their address from the list. The local exchange area and cabinet number will be shown. Once a fibre solution is available a "VDSL" option will be shown. ADSL identifies much slower copper based Broadband

Whilst distance of a property from a cabinet dictates what speeds are available to a property in general properties in Brinton and Sharrington are fibre enabled; similarly Thornage. Parts of Little Thornage are fibre enabled and last month I gave news for other properties in Little Thornage which are to be fibre enabled. Below are dates for Stody and Hunworth.

Stody: Of the 38 properties in Stody most are served from Melton Constable cabinet 1 and 15 of the properties already have speeds over 15Mbps. Another fibre solution is planned towards the end of the rollout late 2019/early 2020. This will serve most of the properties on cabinet 1 which do not have 15Mbps+ already. (Except the Stody Barn complex). 5 properties are served from Melton Constable cabinet 4 but are too far away to have good speeds. Unfortunately currently there are no further fibre plans.

Hunworth: 32 properties are served from Holt cabinet 4. Two fibre solutions are planned subject to survey; Once planned one would be enabled the second half of 2018 and the other late 2019/early 2020. Subject to survey the 32 will be covered for at least 24Mbps after the upgrades. 15 are Holt Exchange Only Lines with a fibre solution planned to cover them all second half of 2018. 5 properties via Melton Constable cabinet 4 have 10-15 Mbps currently with no further fibre plans.




