## **Our Rector writes:**

On my recent pilgrimage to the Holy Land I took Communion in a boat on the Sea of Galilee, renewed my baptismal vows in the River Jordan and walked in the Judean desert, where our Lord was tempted by the devil for forty days. Our visits to Nazareth, Bethlehem, Jericho and Jerusalem, among other places brought the Bible even more to life than ever.

We recently celebrated a service of the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Ashes are an ancient sign of penitence; from the Middle Ages it became the custom to begin the period of Lent by being marked in ash with the sign of the cross. During Lent it is customary that churches are kept bare of flowers and decoration. The Gloria is not said. The fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare or Refreshment Sunday) was allowed as a day of relief from the rigour of Lent. Thus, it is the custom in the U.K. and other countries to observe Mothering Sunday half way through Lent.

As Holy Week approaches, the atmosphere of the season darkens; the readings begin to anticipate the story of Christ's suffering and death and the reading of the Passion Narrative gives the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday its name of Passion Sunday. Christians are invited to approach God afresh, seek penitence and the forgiveness of sin. It's a good time to try to heal difficult relationships, forgive and be forgiven.

# Swanton Novers National Nature Reserve

*Highlights from the reserve*

As some may be aware, we have been running a Heritage Lottery Funded bat monitoring project at Swanton Novers National Nature Reserve, an exciting collaboration between the Bat Conservation Trust and Natural England. With help from a group of volunteers, the project has been busy over the last 2 years gathering bat data from the reserve to help us gain an insight into how bats are affected by woodland management practices and how they use the woods, in particular the interior.

Bat Conservation Trust and Natural England will be running an event on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> of April 2018 at the Swanton Novers Village Hall to share our findings from the bat monitoring project and talk about other conservation work Natural England have carried out on the reserve. There will be bats to look at, followed by lunch and a woodland walk in the afternoon.

## News from County Councillor, Dr Marie Strong, Wells Division

Dear Readers

**Norfolk County Council Budget 2018-19:** There was some good news prior to the actual budget council in that proposals to cut bus route subsidies and highways gritting were withdrawn. However whilst understanding that savings have to be made I stated my disappointment in the cuts to Adult Social Services, Children's Sure Start Centres and the Library Service. The budget for the following year also shows cuts to the mobile library service. Because of the rural nature of the parishes in our division it is not surprising how many people have talked to me about the importance of this service. Therefore having expressed my unhappiness to cuts to this service I have been offered a place on a workshop dealing with proposed changes to the service. I will also see what support there is amongst other councillors in minimising danger to the service.

**Coast Hopper and local bus routes:** You may have read of Stagecoach plans which appeared to threaten the Coasthopper and I know that whilst your villages are not on the actual Coast Hopper route many travel to join the Coast Hopper by other buses or get lifts. The Coast Hopper has been under threat before. First because it was the most highly subsidised bus route in the county, next the then bus operator sold out. However the demand from local people and visitors has to be too great for bus operators to ignore. I am confident that a bus service will be offered all the way along the north Norfolk coast. As to the other routes run by Stagecoach Norfolk County Council staff are holding discussions and we expect to have some positive news soon.

**Safeguarding:** Recently I spent a morning in an informative yet disturbing session regarding the essential work being carried out to protect children and young adults from sex and drug grooming. If you have the opportunity to learn about the threat to our young people please take it up. It is a matter which I believe you will agree we should be better informed.

**Digital, Innovation & Efficiency Committee:** Representatives of the major mobile phone companies again visited the Council. There was talk of co-operation and the visitors were assured that once the county survey of black spots is complete the results will be shared with them. (I would add that I asked for our parishes to be included in the survey.) Obviously it is hoped that the mobile providers will co-operate with us in getting good mobile phone connectivity across our rural areas. I did point out that with some exceptions connectivity relies on masts which are not appreciated in areas such as Norfolk's Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. However, I did add that we had set aside a useful sum of money to invest as newer technology appears.

**Digital Inclusion:** More and more information is shared by emails and websites; but not everyone is equipped to access what is often important information. One of our newer expressions is '**digital inclusion**' which if it is to be achieved by all of Norfolk not only requires everyone to be able to access effective broadband it also means everyone must

have the opportunity to acquire essential skills for using the internet. Thus I am encouraging the library service to once again provide a link between willing students offering to teach basic computer skills and those needing these skills. But there are many very able children and grandchildren who are more than capable of sharing their skills with others. No need to leave it to the youngsters, you can always ask them!



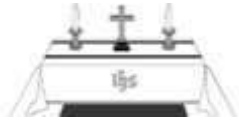
