## Our Rector writes:

A huge thank you to everyone who cleaned and decorated our churches so beautifully for our Easter services and who do a great job throughout the year. Attendance was good and we welcomed visitors and worshippers of all ages and we joined together in numerous other social events, which helps us to appreciate village life. We are very fortunate to be able to bring the spectacular spring flowers into the churches and enjoy their beauty even more.

The Bat conservation Trust has recently informed us that there is a particular relationship with bats and churches that goes back over the centuries. Deforestation has occurred over thousands of years and so bats have adapted to using buildings as roosts, in addition to trees and caves. Parish churches have long been part of the rural landscape and have provided precious roosting sites for many generations of bats. All U.K. bat populations are protected by law because of the huge decline in their numbers over the last century. The downside for us is that bats leave droppings but fortunately they do not present a health hazard.

We are glad to say that St Lawrence church, Hunworth had its first service of the year on Palm Sunday and we used props and drama to help us become part of the story and to bring our worship more to life. We transported ourselves back to Jerusalem on the day that Christ rode into the city on a colt. Our diversity means that we are able to enjoy different kinds of services; from B.C.P. to contemporary worship – all to the glory of God and we give thanks for the many talented people who participate in our worship and help us to find God in our lives.

A Franciscan blessings hints at how we might find God's presence in our lives:

“May God bless us with discomfort at easy answers, half truths and superficial relationships. May God bless us with anger at injustice, oppression and exploitation. May God bless us with enough foolishness to believe that we can make a difference in this world, doing in his name what others claim cannot be done.”



**Mobile Phone Blackspots:** As I reported previously NCC commissioned an extensive independent survey across the county and you will not be surprised to learn that making mobile phone calls in locations across Norfolk are likely to be unsuccessful nearly one in five times. However the main purpose of the survey has been to establish an accurate picture of mobile voice and data coverage in the county and to use this information to work with the major mobile providers to improve coverage and tackle 'not spots'. We will be sharing our findings with the major mobile network operators and have already made the offer of installing their mobile infrastructure on more than 200 public sector buildings and structures (i.e. owned by NCC) in the county. We now need to match these structures with the 'not spots' identified in the survey.

The survey was conducted along more than 3,400 miles of Norfolk's roads and included railway stations, enterprise zones, popular tourist sites. I registered for the survey a number of sites in our division where I knew there to be a problem. We are working on plotting the information collected onto an interactive map which will be available on the council's website. This will allow you to see which of the four major operators (EE, Telefonica/O2, Three and Vodafone) presently have the best coverage for where you live and work – and for your needs. The map and more detailed information about the outcome of the survey is due to be available in time for the next meeting of the council's Digital Innovation and Efficiency Committee (Friday 11 May County Hall). I am a member of this committee of 8 councillors and welcome the opportunity to discuss the survey and the next steps to be taken. In the meantime whilst improvement is being sought across the county I continue to recommend that if your mobile phone provision does NOT marry up with the conditions of your contract, keep records, and continue to contact them until these conditions are met. It was said at the initial presentation for councillors that 'whoever shouts loudest gets attention'. But I am not recommending shouting - simply persistence.

**Pot Holes and Preventing Potholes:** I was pleased to be told that a new seal is being added to more than 320 miles of Norfolk roads during the 2018 surface dressing works. The £10.4m scheme, which has already started, will extend the life of the roads and provide a new skid-resistant surface to help reduce the risk of accidents and potholes. More miles can be added to the scheme due to the £3.4m government funding received due to the 'Beast from the East'. Please be on the look-out for work on the 189.6 miles running through our division. In the meantime please remember you can report potholes and other highways problems yourself and receive news of progress with the work (website below).

**Thornage Traffic:** I hope the advice I have offered as to possible actions to take and happy to discuss further when the new committee has met.

**Useful Websites:** Whilst fibre broadband is reaching more and more homes some people have yet to access it so I have also repeated details below for checking if you can receive fibre broadband and what it will cost. Remember you do not have to change if you are

happy with the speeds you are already receiving.






